Advent Begins This Weekend

This new Year, Year B (in the 3 year Church Cycle) is the Year of Mark, when most of our Gospel Readings during Mass will be taken from Mark's Gospel. 'The Gospel of Mark, considered to be the first of the four Gospels to be written, is the shortest of the four Gospels and the foundation Gospel for the other two synoptic Gospels (Matthew and Luke) – For Mark, the big question throughtout his Gospel is – who is this person, they call the Christ. – It is not until the time of the Crucifiction that Mark names Jesus as – Son of God. – The Roman Centurian, standing guard at the foot of the Cross, recognises the true significance of the event, and is heard to say "In truth, this man is the Son of God" (What an act of Faith)





News From Across The Diocese

Second book of Writings of the late Fr John Cummins

Following the 'runaway success' of the first book, the family of Fr John Cummins have issued a second publication in his memory. This new book, also named "My Life in Your Hands", contains more sermons of Fr. John's.

The new publication is an accompaniment to the initial book which contained the sermons for Sundays in Year A of the 3-year liturgical calendar. This second volume contains Fr. John's sermons for Year B and Year C of the church cycle. It also contains reflections for secondary school students, tributes by friends and numerous photographs.

The late Fr. Cummins was known for his good humour and easy manner as well as his preaching skills. As a young priest, he spent five years in Rome studying for his doctorate in Celtic Spirituality. Fr. John spent most of his priestly ministry in

Carlow town where he was chaplain in the then Regional College and Administrator in the Cathedral. A native of Newbridge, he earlier served in Naas.

He became PP of Abbeyleix and Ballyroan only 18 months before his death. The homilies of Fr. John are rooted not only in scripture, but also in the everyday issues of contemporary Ireland. They will be useful for personal reflection at any time and will be valued by anyone with an interest in religion and spirituality.

"My Life in Your Hands" retails at € 15 and all proceeds after printing costs will be donated to the Diocese of Kildare and Leighlin.

An Advent hymn to think about

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

In many parishes the first sound of Advent is the singing of this traditional hymn. The text for the verses comes from what are known as the 'O antiphons'

that are sung at Evening Prayer on the last days of Advent.

Sometime around the year 1100 an unknown author took these antiphons and turned them into a metrical Latin poem.

Eventually, an Anglican priest named John Mason Neale translated the Latin text into English.

It was published in an 1853 hymnal by Thomas Helmore, using a 15th century French melody.

From these origins we now

have one of the most popular and well known Advent hymns.

The verses convey a plaintive mood of longing and yearning for God with each verse giving a name for Jesus that is full of hope. Notice how the petition of the verse

is met by the joyful promise of the refrain –

'O Come, O come, Emmanuel...Rejoice! Rejoice!

Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel'.

In this Advent season we can call on God to come to us,

knowing in faith, hope and joy that God answers us

Weekly Advent Gospel Link

The First Sunday of Advent marks the start of Year B in the threeyear cycle of Sunday readings in the Church. For the next year, on a Sunday we will hear mainly from the Gospel of Mark.

Today, as we step into the season of Advent, Mark's gospel urges us to 'Be on your guard, stay awake'. (Chapter 13, Verse 33)

This passage is a strong reminder to us to ready ourselves for the coming of the Lord, to be attentive for God at work in our world and in our lives, to take time to pray to God who in love will give us the strength to face our lives in confidence. With hope in the Lord, we believe that Jesus is coming to us all the time. While in our Mass we pray, 'we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ' we must be ready and prepared to welcome Him into our lives today. Are we ready to do this? Are we prepared to let Jesus into the 'stuff' of our lives, into all those corners where he can bring us the hope that comes from Him alone? What would that mean? What might that look like?

Why not spend time reflecting on the Sunday Scriptures this Advent.

See kandle.ie for our weekly Scripture Sharing Reflections on the Advent Sunday readings and look out for a local scripture sharing group. If there isn't one, why not create one yourself and invite others to it. This year, the reflections are taken from homilies preached by the late Fr John Cummins and found in the recently published book, 'My Life In Your Hands, Year & & Year C'

An Advent Tradition for Church and Home:



THE ADVENT WREATH

We invite you to continue or start the tradition of having an Advent wreath in the home. The advent wreath has a rich meaning. The **circle** of the wreath, with no beginning or end, symbolises the eternity of God. The **evergreen** reminds us of the everlasting life we have in Christ while any pine cones or pods in the wreath represent new life and resurrection. The **four candles** represent the four Sundays of Advent. **Purple** is traditionally a colour of penance and prayer while the **rose** pink candle that is lit on the Third Sunday (Gaudete/Rejoice Sunday) marks our joy as we move ever closer to Christmas.

As you light a candle on your Advent wreath for the first time, pray this prayer of blessing and take a moment talk to God about how you will journey through Advent this year alone or as a household. Finish your time of prayer, again, with the Advent prayer: Come, Lord Jesus!


