Fr. Kevin O'Neill R.I.P.

The death has been announced of Msgr Caoimhín Ó Néill, retired President of Carlow College, St. Patrick's.

Msgr Caoimhín Ó Néill held the position of College President at Carlow College, St. Patrick's from 1994 to 2015. A native of Trumera, Mountrath, Co. Laois, Msgr Ó Néill was ordained in 1969. He joined the staff of the College in 1972 and was a staff member for forty-three years. He was involved in the training of seminarians for the priesthood and he lectured in English.

In paying tribute, the current President, Fr Conn Ó Maoldhomhnaigh said that as President, Msgr Ó Néill, "oversaw the transformation of the College, providing access to third level education in the Humanities and Social Care in the south east of Ireland and beyond. He appointed many of the current staff members to the staff of the College".

Msgr Caoimhín was co-founder the Carlow Arts Festival, ÉIGSE Carlow. It was during his presidency that the College Trustees provided the site on the College Campus for VISUAL – the George Bernard Shaw Theatre and Exhibition Centre. Msgr Caoimhín D'Neill, former President of Carlow College, St Patricks, RIP

Msgr. Caoimhín Ó Néill RIP

It is with great regret I announce the death of Msgr. Caoimhín who died today. He was a native of Trumera, Mountrath, Co. Laois. He was ordained in Mountrath on 15 June 1969. He taught in the Parish School in Edenderry from 1969-1972 while also ministering as CC in the parish. In 1972 he was appointed to Carlow College, St. Patrick's where he held many roles and served as President from 1994-2015. There will be plenty of opportunity later to honour his many achievements in the College, achievements that were recognised by being granted the Freedom of Carlow in 2006 and being named Carlow Person of the Year in 2009. He was appointed Monsignor by Pope Benedict XVI in 2009. Many priests in Kildare & Leighlin and far beyond these Irish shores will be forever indebted to his guidance and support during their formation

days. In 2015 he retired to Abbeyleix where he had an opportunity to pursue his great love of art and culture. He will be remembered as an accomplished artist, a scholarly poet, a raconteur but most of all as a faithful priest who served Kildare & Leighlin for 54 years. Ar dheis Dé go raibh a anam uasal.



Tributes have been paid following the passing of Fr Kevin O'Neill of Abbeyleix and Mountrath.

A respected teacher, Fr O'Neill joined Carlow College in 1972 and was a staff member for forty-three years.

He was involved in the training of seminarians for the priesthood and he lectured in English. He became President of the College in 1994 until 2015.

In that role he oversaw the transformation of the College, providing access to third level education in the Humanities and Social Care in the south east of Ireland and beyond.

He appointed many of the current staff members to the staff of the College. He was co-founder the Carlow Arts Festival, EIGSE Carlow.

It was during his presidency that the College Trustees provided the site on the College Campus for VISUAL – the new George Bernard Shaw Theatre and Exhibition Centre.

In recognition of his educational and cultural contribution to the Carlow Town and County and the wider region, Monsignor O'Néill received the Freedom of Carlow (2006), was named the Carlow Person of the Year (2006) and he was created a Prelate of Honour with the title of Monsignor by Pope Benedict XVI in 2009.

Fr Paddy Byrne, Parish Priest in Abbeyleix, paid tribute to Fr O'Neill on Facebook.

He said: "I lost a great friend, Fr. O'Neill. A deeply reflective and honest minister of the Gospel.

"He was kind to me here in Abbeyleix and throughout my priestly life. A prophet who had a wide vision."

Former Laois GAA Chairman Peter O'Neill remembers Fr O'Neill as a young priest.

He said: "The passing of Fr Kevin O Neill is with great sadness, condolences to all his family and order. Fr Kevin came to Edenderry in about 1969 as a young curate.

"He made a massive contribution to the people of the town in particular the youth.

"He started what was to become one of the most vibrant youth clubs in the Country and when he left Fr Pj Mc Evoy another Laois man grew the club to over 500 members.

"Fr O'Neill also started the Athletics club and I still have one of his certificate of Achievements for competing in Road races (everyone got one) I met him last year in O Moore Park after almost 30 years and he still had a fantastic charisma about him.

"He left a lasting impression on anyone he crossed paths with and will be sadly missed by all. May he Rest in Peace."

Robert William Henry Armitage. Known to many as Bob.

Robert was born on 27^{th} Sept. 1972 at Ballyfin, the eldest of a family of five, two boys and three girls.

His parents being farmers, he grew up in an environment surrounded by animals and all the other trappings of agricultural life.

He attended Mountrath National School and later Ballyfin college where he was keenly involved in sport, often as a goalie. He may not have been too often top of the class in his studies, but he always showed a keen intelect that marked him out as someone who would succeed in life, and in due course, school days over, school bag quickly abandoned to the dust bin, he settled down to start his working life on his parent's farm.

Sadly in 1995 when Robert was only 22, his father passed away and at that young age he had to take responsibility for running the business and though life was tough, he manfully shouldered that responsibility as he grew and developed and made a very successful career of his chosen path.

And to boost his income, he began to help in Mountrath mart, where he came to love the comraderie and buzz of the whole place, for cattle, chat and company were his joys in life.

And he loved to get a good deal. Was it cows on Done Deal or whatever, he'd say "We'll go have a look. Maybe we'll buy a few." Just last week, he heard about straw that was going at a reasonable price. Today, it is sitting in his shed – a small part of the monument to his lifetimes work.

And he was generous. When he heard that a friend's straw had been burned, he turned up unannounced with a load of straw.

Robert may never have been too sure of where exactly the sweeping brush was stored, and hoovering out his jeep was a passtime to be avoided at all costs, but animal welfare and their care and comfort and wellbeing were maybe the most important things in his daily work. But work alone didn't always hold the centre of his attention. Like all young people, he was out with his friends – parties discos etc. And on the way home very possibly a stop for a Snack Box, and maybe a couple of battered sausages thrown in just to bulk it up a bit. Robert liked his food. And socialising lead him to Lisdoonvarna, and in 2004 to meet the love of his life, Liz.

Soon he was clocking up the miles up and down to Cork. Liz, you must have been feeding him Barrys Tea.

And then on 1st Sept.2006, they were married and he became an instant stepfather to Finbarr, Hazel, Noel, Alan, Stephen and Robert, and the family settled down to live, in Ballyfin.

And Robert was a keen church man, serving in this church on the vestry and as a church warden responsible for much of the running of the place.

and the Ballyfin Vintage club reaped the benefit of his membership and enthusaism as he helped to organise and be involved in the various events of the organisation.

And he could take it easy too. Seated comfortably on a Sunday afternoon, mug of tea in hand – had to be his David Brown mug – watching the Sunday game. If the "Vicar of Dibley" was on, That was his programme.

Anywhere you would meet him, his first remark "How's it going." if you had some difficulty and asked a favour – only one reply – "That's no problem."

Sadly, in recent years, Robert suffered health problems and was obliged to spend a number of terms in hospital and return for regular check-ups there, but to the question "how are you?" the answer was always the same. He was fine. Never any complaints. When he was no longer able to do much physical work, he was always happy that he could still drive. It was important to

him to be mobile, even if there were frequent stops for his favourite passtime – the mug of tea, or two or more.

On Saturday morning last Robert was all business organising his day. He phoned a neighbour to say he was going into Mountmellick and would need his help with some farm work when he came home, and off he went. Having completed his business he went to the chemist to collect his prescription, and said to the girl there that he wasn't feeling great. She got him a chair to sit on, and then, God pulled the plug as darkness fell on all who held him dear, for Robert had started on his final journey, the journey to his heavenly home, and we were left to mourn, But grieve not friends, for Robert would not want us to be sad. Let us rather turn the darkness into light, as we rejoice in his life, the sport, the fun, and the laughter he has left us all as a memory.

If we can for a moment dream, can we picture Robert approaching Heaven's Gate.

Maybe God says to him "Welcome to Paradise."

I wonder, does Robert look at him in that special way he had and answer "Ok, ok, but first, any chance of a mug of tea?"

And as God gets out the good china and Robert looks at those tiny cups, maybe he might add, "Jeepers, I should have brought my David Brown mug?" for it was the only thing that held a decent amount of his favourite beverage.

Farewell Robert (Bob) dear son, dear husband, dear step father, dear brother, dear nephew, dear friend. From all whom you blessed with your friendship in this life, "May you rest in peace until we meet again."
