### Burglary Prevention Tips from An Garda Siochana

As we approach the time of year when the clocks are set to go back, we are once again appealing to people to secure their homes and premises and to Lock Up and Light Up during the winter months. Traditionally Burglaries increase by 20% over the winter months of October to March. Some simple methods can make your home and premises less vulnerable to Criminal Attack.

- 。 Lighting around the house on a sensor or photocell.
- 。 Lighting inside on timers

Natural Surveillance- trim shrubs down to 1m and trees up to 2 m.

- 。 Use Bogus Caller Cards
- 。 Close Curtains during hours of Darkness.

What Attracts the Burglar:

- 。 Signs of being unoccupied.
- 。 *Open Windows*
- 。 Hidden keys
- 。 A build up of Post /Milk, etc.
- 。 *No alarms.*
- 。 High vegetation
- 。 Ladders or tools in easy reach
- Easy access to the rear of your house
- 。 Poor lighting or house lights on at the wrong time.

### The St Willibrord Biennial Lecture 2022

On Mon. Nov. 7th, the third St Willibrord Biennial Lecture will take place in St Laserian's Cathedral, Old Leighlin, starting at 7pm.

This year's speaker will be Luxembourger Dr Michel Summer of Heidelberg University, Germany, who will speak on 'From Rath Melsigi To Rome: St Willibrord's Career In Its European Context'. Michel completed his PhD in Trinity College on St Willibrord and his English biography of Willibrord will be published in 2023.

This lecture marks the Feast Day of St Willibrord, Patron Saint of Luxembourg, First Apostle of the Netherlands and his Co Carlow connection. St Willibrord spent twelve years at the famed monastery of Rath Melsigi, Clonmelsh, County Carlow, before he was ordained at the famous monastery of Old Leighlin. He left Co. Carlow on his successful European Mission in AD690. He was made Bishop and Archbishop of Utrecht in the Netherlands before establishing his major monastery and scriptorium in Echternach, Luxembourg. He is remembered each year in Echternach with a UNESCO World Heritage Status hopping procession. In 2017, the town of Echternach presented a relic of St Willibrord to the county and it is permanently displayed in the Cathedral of the

Assumption, Carlow Town. In 2019 Carlow County Council and Echternach Town signed a Friendship Agreement.

The Biennial Lecture is hosted by St Laserian's Cathedral, coordinated by Carlow County Museum in partnership with the Diocese of Kildare & Leighlin, the Diocese of Leighlin and Carlow County Council.

## Association of Catholics Ireland, Zoom Meeting

Pitfalls in the Terminology of Sacrifice" with Dr Tom O'Loughlin According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, the sacrament of the Mass - the Eucharist - is called 'the Holy Sacrifice because it makes present the one sacrifice of Christ the Saviour and includes the Church's offering'. (1330)

In September 2022 Archbishop Eamon Martin asked Irish Catholics to think of making 'personal sacrifices in answer to the cry of the Earth'. And yet Christian ideas of sacrifice have been blamed by some historians for much of the violence of history, including the Crusades, the expansion of European imperialism and colonialism from c.1450, and the bloodletting of World War I.

So how are we to understand Christian sacrifice today, faced with 21st century challenges?

In examining aspects of the history of the idea of sacrifice, Dr Tom O'Loughlin, emeritus professor of historical theology at Nottingham

University, will deal with "some of the pitfalls in the way we use the terminology of sacrifice".
